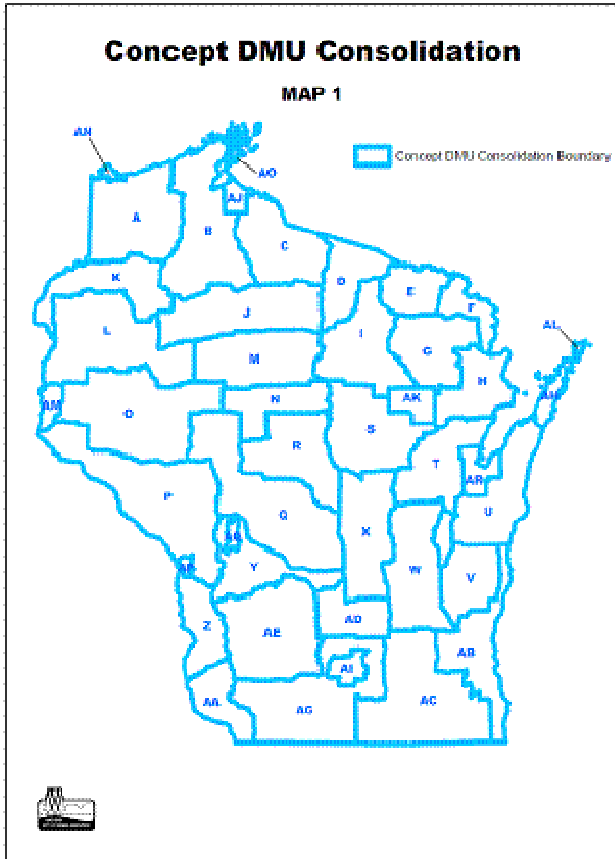

**I. Deer Management Unit Consolidation DNR Concept 1:**



Consolidating deer management units is likely to improve the precision of our deer herd estimates.

Reducing the number of DMUs we currently have would provide simplification for hunters and improved compliance with rules related to DMU boundaries. Fewer units will mean that fewer hunters will be impacted by unit boundaries, such as roads, that split a single property.

This DMU consolidation concept was based on the following factors:

- Deer range;
- Population goal densities (deer/sq mile);
- Hunter density and hunting, pressure;
- Public hunting land (open to hunting);
- Biological factors such as deer harvests (per sq. mile), and harvest age structure;
